They should be detailed. You are expected to spend 2 to 4 hours on each project; they are to be completely finished and polished; they should represent your best work. Projects may not be turned in late without a note requesting extra time from your parent(s) – no other explanation is needed. B1 Ancient Egypt Project	Due: Monday, October 2nd
<input type="checkbox"/> Poster Option: Create a mini tri-fold board that explains how the pyramids may have been built. Include information from your textbook and elsewhere. Your poster must be written in your own words. Minimum size is 12 x 20 inches; maximum size is 16 x 24 inches.	
<input type="checkbox"/> Model Option: Create a detailed model of the Double Crown of Menses. Attach a one-paragraph description explaining the significance of the crown and why it was originally made the way it was. Try to make it a wearable size.	
B2 Ancient Greece Project	Due: Monday, December 11th
<input type="checkbox"/> Poster Option: Create a mini tri-fold board about Greek architecture's influence in America. Include information from your textbook and elsewhere. Your poster must be written in your own words. Minimum size is 12 x 20 inches; maximum size is 16 x 24 inches.
